

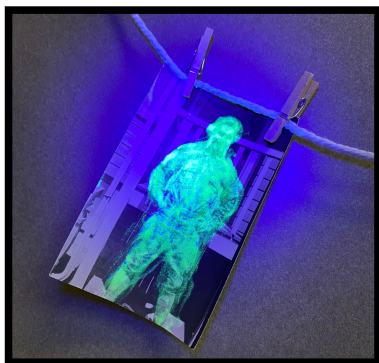

## Glowing Ghost Photos

Create creepy glow-in-the-dark ghost photos this Halloween to surprise family members and friends. Perfect for Halloween parties or spooky decorations.

## Ingredients (Included)

- vintage photographs
- Tulip glow-in-the dark fabric paint
- black light flashlight
- paint brush
- mini clothespins
- twine
- some Halloween goodies!

## You Supply:

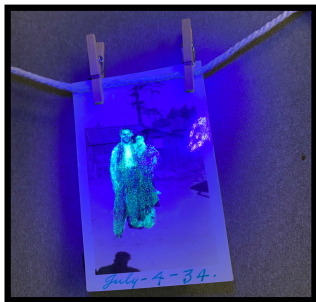
- 3 AAA batteries for the flashlight
- optional: your own photos, if you want to make more!

## Directions:

1. Use the paintbrush and the glow-in-the-dark paint to create a ghostly figure in your photos.

You can:

- paint a layer over the people in the photograph, to make them the ghosts
- paint a ghost behind or to the side of people in the photo
- paint a ghost in the background
- any other idea you have!

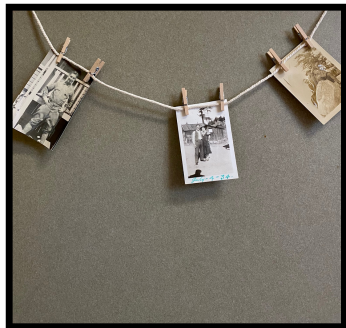


## Directions, cont...



2. Start with a thin layer of paint, let dry, then add more layers if needed to achieve maximum glowing-ness. You can see how much your photo will glow by using the black light flashlight.

3. Using the twine and the mini clothespins, hang your photo banner along the wall, in your locker, or wherever you want your Halloween decor. They work great as part of a larger display.



TIP: If you use enough layers of paint and expose the doctored photos to sunlight for long enough, they will glow in the dark without the black light flashlight for a short time. However, a black light of any kind will be the easiest and fastest way to see the glow effect.
